What are the main duties of the role?

This role will make a real difference in enhancing the quality of case management, maximise person satisfaction and reduce avoidable admissions whilst facilitating discharge from hospital.

The successful candidate will be a key member of the MDT, reviewing recent hospital admissions and discharges that have been identified as at risk of further unplanned hospital admissions. The role includes defining, monitoring and evaluating actions taken to meet the person's health and psychosocial needs.

A key role of the MDT is to identify the people who would benefit from the YICT service which offers the following:

- Co-ordinate and provide care that is safe, timely, effective, efficient, equitable and client-centred
- Manage and review caseload
- Facilitate support as needed (case coordination, information sharing etc.)
- Help make informed decisions by acting as their advocate regarding their clinical status and treatment options
- Develop effective working relations and cooperate with health teams and liaise with social services, health and voluntary agencies
- Promote quality and cost-effective interventions and outcomes
- Maintain accurate and appropriate patient records on clinical systems

- Ability to build positive rapport with a diverse range of internal colleagues and clients
- Ability to work autonomously whilst also having an awareness of the scope of your role when identifying the need to access the wider clinical team appropriately and safely
